#### Introduction

# Do the Right Thing

### **About Today's Lesson...**

Abandoning the covenant, worshiping other gods, and serving other gods - all disastrous traits that led the people of Judah to misery and destruction. Though Jeremiah the prophet was in relentless pursuit of changing the evil culture of his people, the people continued with their refusal to make God a priority. They refused to "do the right thing". With a mournful posture, Jeremiah rhetorically states "Is there no balm in Gilead; is there no physician there? why then is not the health of the daughter of my people recovered?" (Jeremiah 8:22, KJV). The "medicine" for spiritual healing was available, but the people refused it.

In this lesson, the prophet Jeremiah continues to announce God's call for justice. God, "the divine medicine" available to the people, first calls on leaders to do the right things. Then the peoples' blatant disregard for the covenant is brought to light.
