About Today's Lesson...

Have you ever found yourself turning away from long-standing values you previously held? For example, do you still hold the door for a person behind you when entering a building? Do you keep promises? Do you still say "thank you" after someone has provided you a service? Holding on to ethical values in today's world can be challenging - especially when others reciprocate in unethical ways. It is easy to lose our sense of direction in life and turn away from godly values we used to adhere to.

In today's lesson, the priest and scribe Ezra returns to Jerusalem with a second group of exiles only to discover that the people had engaged in ungodly marriages.
